January 13/14, Grand Coteau, LA: Dr. Sax spoke to parents (1/13), and led a two-day workshop for teachers, hosted by the Academy of the Sacred Heart. This workshop was attended by educators from across south Louisiana as well as from Texas.

January 15, Shreveport, LA: Dr. Sax returned to Caddo Parish to lead an additional day of professional development workshops for public school teachers there.

January 19, Red Deer, Alberta: Dr. Sax provided a full-day workshop for public school teachers, on gender-specific best practice for the content areas, sponsored by the Central Alberta Regional Consortium.

January 21, Toronto, Ontario: Dr. Sax gave the opening keynote address for a conference of the Ontario Public School Boards' Association.

February 8, Paget, Bermuda: Dr. Sax spoke at Bermuda College to public school counselors and administrators about sex differences in the propensity to delinquent behavior: girls and boys both get into trouble, but they typically get into different kinds of trouble.

February 8/9, Devonshire, Bermuda: Dr. Sax spoke to more than 600 parents (2/8) – that's about 1% of the population of Bermuda – and led a full-day workshop for teachers (2/9), hosted by Somersfield Academy.

February 20, Houston, TX: Dr. Sax led a full-day conference on gender-specific best practice for public schools; this conference was attended by educators from across Texas as well as from Kansas and Nevada.

February 20, Houston, TX: Dr. Sax spoke to doctors from Methodist Hospital about the effect of endocrine disruptors on child and adolescent development.

March 18 – 19, Rochester, NY: Dr. Sax spoke to parents (3/18) and led a full-day workshop for teachers (3/19), at McQuaid Jesuit School.

March 27, Towson, MD: Dr. Sax led a workshop on sex differences in speech pathology and in hearing, for the annual conference of the Maryland Speech & Hearing Association.

April 13 – 14, Los Angeles, CA: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on gender-specific best practice, for teachers at the Young Oak Kim Academy, a public charter school; he also spoke to parents (4/13).

- April 16, North St. Paul, MN: Dr. Sax spoke to school administrators about how to broaden educational horizons and to break down gender stereotypes. He also visited Carver Elementary, a local public school.

October 14, New York, NY: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop on gender issues in education, as well as an evening forum for parents, at the Grace Church School.

October 19, Greenwich, CT: Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers, and spoke to parents, at the Stanwich School.

October 20, Bryn Mawr, PA: Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers at the Agnes Irwin School; he also spoke to parents that evening.

October 22, Halifax, Nova Scotia: Dr. Sax led workshops at a provincial education conference, on gender differences in best practice for the content areas.

October 25: St. Louis, MO: Dr. Sax returned to the Imagine Academy of Academic Success to lead a fourth day of professional development for teachers there.

October 26, St. Paul, MN: Dr. Sax gave a full-day presentation entitled "Boys adrift, and girls on the edge," hosted by the University of Minnesota Continuing Education Center.

October 27, Rochester, MN: Dr. Sax gave a full-day presentation entitled “Why Gender Matters: the importance of gender in early intervention with at-risk youth,” hosted by Rochester Community College.

October 29, Baltimore, MD: Dr. Sax led a second day of professional development for the SEED School, a public charter boarding school.

November 1, Mississauga, Ontario: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop for the Peel District School Board, on the topic of “girls on the edge”. This workshop was attended by more than 500 educators and other school professionals.

November 3, Lake Forest, IL: Dr. Sax spoke to students, and led a workshop for teachers, at the Woodlands Academy of the Sacred Heart. He also spoke to parents about the challenges facing teenagers in the era of social media.

November 8, Aventura, FL: Dr. Sax led a workshop about the dangers of endocrine disruptors.

November 9 – 10, East Hampton, New York: Dr. Sax led a series of workshops for teachers at the Ross School. He also met with girls, and with boys, in grades 5 through 12, in eight separate sessions over two days, to discuss the effects of popular culture on gender-specific issues. He also gave an evening presentation for parents about the challenges facing girls and boys in grades 5 through 12 today.

November 11, Wisconsin Dells, WI: Dr. Sax provided the keynote address at a conference for juvenile justice professionals, hosted by the University of Wisconsin. The keynote was entitled “Gender differences in the propensity to delinquent behavior.” He also led breakout sessions specifically on the challenges facing girls at risk, as well as boy-specific issues, from the perspective of what juvenile justice professionals need to know.

November 12, St. Louis, MO: Dr. Sax returned to the Imagine Academy of Academic Success to lead a fifth day of professional development for teachers.

November 15 and 16, Sonoma, CA: Dr. Sax led two days of workshops for teachers, hosted by the Presentation School. He also gave an evening presentation to parents regarding the challenges facing girls and boys today.

November 17, Princeton, NJ: Dr. Sax gave an evening presentation to parents about the challenges facing girls and boys in the era of social media and video games.

November 24, Port Ewen, NY: Dr. Sax gave the keynote address for Ulster County professionals who work with children and

teenagers. He also led a breakout session on texting, Facebook, and cyberbullying; and a second breakout session on best practice for identification and intervention with children and teenagers who are engaging in NSSI (non-suicidal self-injury).

November 29, Austin, TX: Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers at St. Stephen's School. He also gave two presentations to parents: one about "girls on the edge," and the other about "boys adrift."

December 6, Greenwich, CT: Dr. Sax spoke to parents at the Convent of the Sacred Heart.

December 8, Columbus, OH: Dr. Sax led the first of a three-day strand of professional development for teachers with Columbus Public Schools; subsequent days were February 9 and May 11, 2011.
