

## **Leonard Sax MD PhD**

### **2008 events**

January 7, Aurora, Ontario: Dr. Sax spoke to faculty at St. Andrew's College about gender differences in learning; that evening, he spoke to parents.

January 8, Scarborough, Ontario: Dr. Sax met with educators from Brebeuf, Chaminade, and McNeil High Schools; that evening, he spoke to parents.

January 9, Toronto, Ontario: Dr. Sax spoke to faculty, and to parents, at the Crescent School.

January 10, Richmond Hill, Ontario: Dr. Sax led an all-day session for more than 400 educators with the York Region District School Board

January 16, Washington DC: Dr. Sax spoke to parents at the Blessed Sacrament School about gender differences in learning.

January 22 to January 30, United Kingdom: Dr. Sax led events in England and Scotland, in a tour organized by the International Boys Schools Coalition. Dr. Sax spoke to parents at Dulwich College, near London (January 22). On January 23, he led a full-day workshop at the Tonbridge School in Kent which was attended by educators from Eton, Harrow, Monmouth and other leading independent schools from across England as well as Wales. On January 24, he met with teachers at Winchester College. On January 28, he led another full-day workshop, hosted by Loughborough Grammar School, attended by educators from both state schools and independent schools from all around the East Midlands. On January 29 he led a workshop for teachers, and met with parents, at the Newcastle School for Boys in Newcastle-upon-Tyne. His final workshop was at the Merchiston Castle School in Edinburgh, January 30, where he also spoke with parents.

February 6, Albuquerque, NM: Dr. Sax led an all-day seminar for public school teachers from Albuquerque, Las Cruces, and Santa Fe, on gender differences in learning. This event was hosted by New Mexico MESA ([www.nmmesa.org](http://www.nmmesa.org)).
