### 2009 events

- January 29, New Orleans, LA: Dr. Sax presented Grand Rounds to the Department of Psychiatry, LSU School of Medicine, on the topic of "Evaluation of the child who is not paying attention."
- January 29 and 30, New Orleans, LA: Dr. Sax led an evening forum for parents (1/29) and led a workshop for teachers (1/30), at the Academy of the Sacred Heart.
- February 4, Wisconsin Dells, WI: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop for educators from Madison, Portage, Stevens Point, Sun Prairie, Wisconsin Dells, and other school districts, on the importance of gender differences in education.
- February 5, Milwaukee, WI: Dr. Sax gave two presentations at the annual conference of the Wisconsin State Reading Association: "Noisy Time Story Time" (for librarians) and "Why Gender Matters" (for classroom educators).
- February 5: Lake Forest, IL: Dr. Sax led an evening forum for parents, hosted by Lake Forest Country Day School, on the topic of "Why Gender Matters."
- February 12, Philadelphia, PA: Dr. Sax visited Boy's Latin of Philadelphia, an all-boys public charter school.
- February 16, Waco, TX: Dr. Sax led a district-wide workshop for teachers in the Waco School District, at the Waco Convention Center.
- February 17, Warrenton, VA: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop for teachers at the Highland School; that evening, he spoke to parents.
- April 14, Duluth, MN: Dr. Sax spoke to physicians at St. Luke's Hospital about "the diagnosis and misdiagnosis of ADHD."
- April 14 and 15, Duluth, MN: Dr. Sax led an evening forum for parents about the importance of gender differences; he also led a two-day workshop for public school teachers.
- April 18 and 19: Middlesex, England: Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers at the Harrow School (founded in 1572; alma mater of seven British prime ministers, including Winston Churchill). He also led a forum for parents at Harrow about how the "boys adrift" phenomenon is manifest in England.
- April 20, London, England: Dr. Sax visited the City of London School for Girls and met with sixth formers there.

- April 21, Munich, Germany: Dr. Sax spoke to parents at the Pasinger Fabrik about the growing phenomenon of unmotivated boys in Germany, as part of the promotion for the German version of *Boys Adrift*, titled *Jungs im Abseits*.
- April 23, Madrid, Spain: Dr. Sax gave a two-hour presentation about the importance of gender differences in education, as the guest of the IESE (*Instituto de Estudios Superiores de la Empresa*, [www.iese.edu](http://www.iese.edu)).
- April 29, Mississauga, Ontario: Dr. Sax gave a full-day presentation about the “boys adrift” phenomenon in Canada. This event, hosted by the Peel District School Board, was attended by more than 1,200 educators from all over Ontario.
- April 29, Burlington, Ontario: Dr. Sax led an evening forum for parents at Burlington Central High School
- May 1, Maryville, Tennessee: Dr. Sax was the keynote speaker for an education conference hosted by Blount County Public Schools.
- May 21 and 22, Green Oaks, IL: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop for teachers at the Oak Grove School; he also led an evening forum for parents.
- June 8 and 9, Rocky Mount, NC: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on gender-aware instruction for Rocky Mount Preparatory School, a public charter school. This workshop was also attended by educators from Florida, Indiana, Nevada, and Ontario.
- June 11 and 12, Tulsa, OK: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop for teachers with Tulsa Public Schools, on best practices for single-sex education. He also spoke with parents (6/11), explaining the rationale for single-sex education.
- July 27 and 28, St. Louis, Missouri: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on best practices for single-sex classrooms, hosted by Carman Trails Elementary School and Maryville University. This workshop was attended by teachers from four schools in St. Louis as well as by educators from Oklahoma, Indiana, and Michigan.
- August 3 and 4, Shreveport, LA: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on best practice for single-sex classrooms, for Caddo Heights Elementary School. He also spoke to parents (8/3) to explain the rationale for single-sex education.
- August 13, Shreveport, LA: Dr. Sax conducted a workshop for Caddo Parish middle school teachers who will be leading single-sex classrooms.
- August 17 and 18, Parkersburg, WV: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on best practice for single-sex classrooms, hosted by Van Devender Middle

School; he also spoke to parents about the rationale for single-sex classrooms.

August 20 and 21, Washington, DC: Dr. Sax led a two-day workshop on best practice for single-sex classrooms, for Randle Highlands Elementary School; he also spoke to parents about the rationale for single-sex classrooms.

August 24, St. Albans, WV: Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers at Anne Bailey Elementary School, on best practice for single-sex classrooms; that evening, he spoke to parents about the rationale for single-sex education.

August 25, Beckley, WV: Dr. Sax led a workshop on best practice for single-sex education; that evening, he spoke to parents about the rationale for single-sex education.

September 3, Burlington, Ontario: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop on best practice for single-sex classrooms, for educators at Burlington Central High School. That evening, he met with administrators from the Halton District School Board.

September 15, Marion, OH: Dr. Sax led a morning workshop for the "Wild Child" workshop, on gender differences in the propensity to delinquent behavior. In the afternoon, he led a seminar on "girls on the edge." This seminar was attended by counselors and other professionals from all around Ohio, from Cleveland to Columbus to Cincinnati and Zanesville.

September 28, Sydney, Nova Scotia (Cape Breton): Dr. Sax led a workshop for teachers, and spoke to parents, at Riverview High School.

October 10 and 11, Atlanta, GA: Dr. Sax hosted the fifth international conference of the National Association for Single Sex Public Education, which was attended by 464 educators not only from all across the United States but also from Argentina, Bermuda, Canada, and Poland.

October 14, Toronto, Ontario: Dr. Sax led an afternoon workshop for the directors of Youth Justice Centres across Ontario. This presentation was sponsored by Youth Justice Services, Ontario Ministry of Children and Youth.

October 23, Halifax, Nova Scotia: Dr. Sax led a full-day workshop on gender differences in elementary education, hosted by the Primary Elementary Teachers' Association, PETA. This workshop was attended by more than 500 public school teachers from across Nova Scotia.

November 17, Albuquerque, NM: Dr. Sax was the keynote speaker for a full-day conference on the growing disengagement of boys from school, hosted by the New Mexico Men's Council for Boys and Young Men.

November 19, Delran, NJ: Dr. Sax spoke to parents about gender differences.

November 24, Toronto, Ontario: Dr. Sax led a second workshop for Youth Justice Services, Ontario Ministry of Children and Youth.

November 24, 25, and 26, Toronto, Ontario: Dr. Sax led two town-hall style meetings, hosted by the Toronto school board, in association with plans to launch two all-boys public elementary schools in Toronto in the fall of 2010. Dr. Sax also visited two Toronto public schools (11/25) and spoke to the school board (11/26).
